Unraveling the mysteries of the brain requires studying it across different levels of organization using molecular, cellular, systems, behavioural, and computational neuroscience approaches. However, since there are a very few formal undergraduate or post-graduate Neuroscience programs in India, many students from other disciplines are still unsure of what neuroscience research entails and how they can become a part of it.

Centre for Neuroscience (CNS) at IISc Bangalore would like to invite students who are planning to pursue a career in Neuroscience for an online interaction session with CNS faculty, where we will first provide a general overview of the research labs/activities in CNS. Afterwards, students can clarify any questions that they might have regarding the admission procedures, graduate student's life at CNS and IISc in general.

Who can apply for the CNS PhD program?

Given the interdisciplinary nature of neuroscience, we welcome students from diverse backgrounds. While we understand that students would have their domain knowledge specific to their individual exposure, we do expect students to possess some basic level neuroscience, that reflects the motivation of students to pursue a PhD at CNS. Neuroscience is an inherently multi-disciplinary field, and the varied backgrounds of our PhD students provides an ideal setting for tackling neuroscience research questions from diverse perspectives.
